

Re: Category 1 and Category 2 exemptions under Part 23 of the National Gas Rules (NGR) - WPP Inpex Lateral

As you would be aware, the WPP Inpex Lateral managed by Power and Water Corporation holds Category 1 and Category 2 exemptions granted by the AER under Part 23 of the NGR. The expiry date of the exemptions is 1 March 2024.

Gas pipeline regulation reforms to the National Gas Law (NGL) and NGR were proclaimed in March 2023 and are now in effect. Rule 12 of Schedule 6 of the NGR describes how a holder of a Category 2 exemption under Part 23 (which has now been repealed) will be taken to have been granted an exemption under the new Part 10 of the NGR.

We are therefore writing to inform you about the gas pipeline regulation reforms, how the WPP Inpex Lateral may be affected by these changes and the application process for a new exemption under Part 10 of the NGR.

Existing Exemptions

Based on the information provided by Power and Water Corporation in your Part 23 exemption application of 22 March 2019, we have identified that the following exemptions granted in respect of the pipelines may be affected by recent changes to Part 10 and Part 23 (now repealed) of the NGR:

Category 1 exemption:

- There are no provisions for former Part 23 Category 1 exemptions to be transitioned to the new Part 10.
- Category 1 exemptions therefore ceased to have effect from 16 March 2023.

The gas pipeline regulation reforms are contained in the Statutes Amendment (National Energy Laws) (Gas Pipelines) Act 2022 (SA) which came into operation on 2 March 2023, and the National Gas Rules (Gas Pipelines) Amendment Rules 2023 (SA) which was gazetted on 16 March 2023 and are consolidated into version 68 of the NGR.

Category 2 exemption (based on no third-party access):

Under rule 12 of Schedule 6 of the NGR, the holder of a Category 2 exemption granted under Part 23 of the NGR (as in force immediately before 2 March 2023²) in relation to a pipeline that is not a third-party pipeline, will be taken to have been granted a Category 1 exemption under Part 10 Division 2 Subdivision 2 of the NGR (as in force after 2 March 2023).

- This means that under the new rules, exempt pipelines are not obligated to publish all information under Subdivision 1 of Part 10 in relation to the pipeline.
- Service providers under Part 10 Category 1 exemptions are exempt from the requirement to <u>publish</u> a user access guide³ but must <u>prepare and maintain</u> a user access guide.
- Service providers under Part 10 Category 1 exemptions are also exempt from ss 139, 140, 141, 147 and 148 of the NGL (per NGR rule 35).

Information we require from Power and Water Corporation

Please confirm whether there have been any changes to the information provided to the AER in your NGR Part 23 exemption application for the WPP Inpex Lateral (for your reference, the information provided in your Part 23 exemption applications is included in Attachment 1).

Applications for new exemptions

Going forward, applications for new exemptions must be made under the new Part 10 of the NGR which contains some key differences to the former Part 23. Should you wish to apply for a new Category 1 exemption under Part 10 upon expiry of your existing exemptions, we require that a new application form be completed and submitted to us.
