Annual Compliance Order for gas pipeline service providers 2024 - consultation

AGL Energy (AGL) welcomes the opportunity to provide feedback on the Australian Energy Regulator (AER) Annual Compliance Order (ACO) for gas pipeline service providers 2024 consultation.

AGL supports recent compliance changes to the National Gas Law (NGL) and National Gas Rules (NGR), and the AER's proposed ACO for gas pipeline service providers 2024, as these are likely to lead to:

- Improved transparency.
- Improved commercial negotiation with pipeline service providers.
- More cost-effective services.
- Reduced risk of uncompetitive practices.

Furthermore, we consider:

- the information sought in the ACO is clear and understandable.
- the template for responses to the ACO is accessible and fit for purpose.
- the scope of the information sought in the ACO is appropriate.
- the level of assurance sought for information provided, as contained in clause five, is appropriate.
- the benefits associated with greater transparency, improved commercial negotiation, costeffectiveness, and competition, outweigh the additional burden on businesses to compile a response to the latest ACO.
