If new transmission infrastructure is necessary I want to ensure that we as consumers are paying for the 'right, next generation, world's best practice' infrastructure that doesn't have disastrous costs for people, communities, agriculture and the environment. Don't approve funding for HumeLink as an overhead option. Undergrounding Humelink is the best, safest and cheapest long term option for Australia!

Furthermore, living in bushfire country I find the governments insistence on overhead transmission inexcusable. Not only have overhead lines caused bushfires in the past, they prevent the Fire Services from accessing critical areas during a fire.
