

Energex Limited December 23-January 24 Severe Storms and Rainfall Event Claim of Confidentiality

October 2024

1. Requirement

The Australian Energy Regulator (AER) requires that Energex prepares a separate confidentiality claim for each piece of information it claims to be confidential. This document provides the required confidentiality claims.

In the required tabulated format, we provide:

- The document identification,
- The page or paragraph numbers for the sections that are considered confidential,
- A description of the confidential information,
- The topic covered by the confidential information,
- The category of the confidential information (security of the network, market sensitive cost inputs, market intelligence, strategic information, personal information, other) with supporting rationale,
- The detriment caused by the publication of the confidential information, and
- The optional consideration of the trade-off between the identified detriment and the public benefit should the information be released.

This document also provides information on the proportion of confidential information as required by the AER's Confidentiality Guideline.

2. Confidential information

The following table provides the required information where Energex has claimed confidentiality over information.
