Re: APT Pipelines (NT) Pty Ltd request to extend time for submission of reference service proposal

I refer to your letter of 6 June 2019 with which you sought to extend the time for submission of the reference service proposal for the Amadeus Gas Pipeline (Amadeus) beyond 1 July 2019.

Based on the information provided, I understand:

- APT Pipelines (NT) Pty Ltd (APT NT) is preparing its reference service proposal
- in doing so APT NT will consult with users and end-users of Amadeus
- this process of consultation is unlikely to be completed before 1 July 2019.

Your letter requested that the AER extend the time limit for submission of a reference service proposal. That time limit is 12 months prior to the review submission date for the access arrangement.

You requested that time limit be extended to 1 August 2019, an extension of 1 calendar month.

In considering this matter I have noted:

- NGR Rule 47A was established 21 March 2019
- stakeholder consultation is a key element of a service provider's development of a reference service proposal
- use of the AGP going forward may be substantially affected by construction of the Northern Gas Pipeline (NGP) which will intersect with Amadeus
- consultation with prospective users and end-users will require more time than if the NGR interconnection were not to occur

your proposed time extension will avoid triggering NGR 47A(5) which states that, should
a reference service proposal fail to be submitted by a date 11 months prior to the review
submission date, the AER must itself propose a reference service proposal.

Consistent with the AER's 'Compliance and Enforcement Statement of Approach' the AER has discretion in deciding whether to take enforcement action and the nature of that action. In this case I have specifically considered:

- the nature and extent of the conduct that forms the breach
- the impact of the conduct including any detriment to consumers or other parties
- the extent of any potential future gain by APT NT
- APT NT's actions in relation to this matter.

Based on the material before me, I do not propose to take any action in relation to any potential breach of NGR 47A(3) that occurs solely as a result of submission of a reference service proposal no later than 1 August 2019. This decision is based on your letter of 6 June 2019.

The approach to take no action in respect of non-compliance with the 1 July time limit gives effect to your request.

This decision should not be interpreted as a general approval or acceptance by the AER of non-compliance with the NGR.
