


Process to date

- AEMC rule change determination on November 2012
- Deferral of full regulatory determination process for ActewAGL's next regulatory control period (2014–19)
- Better Regulation guideline development process in 2013
- Placeholder revenue allowance for a transitional regulatory control period (1 July 2014 to 30 June 2015) in April 2014
- Receipt of ActewAGL's regulatory proposal 31 May 2014
- Publication of ActewAGL's regulatory proposal 11 July 2014
- Publication of issues paper 25 July 2014



How proposal affect consumers

AER approach

- Our analysis of ActewAGL's regulatory proposal will necessarily consider each of the revenue components and any inter-relationships between these components as we must decide its revenues as a whole.
- In assessing the proposed revenue, we will have regard to our 'Better Regulation' Guidelines, including:
 - For capex and opex we will have regard to our Expenditure Assessment
 Guideline and the results from our first benchmarking report
 - For the cost of financing (require rate of return) we will have regard to our Rate of Return Guideline
- We will be interested in hearing consumer views on ActewAGL's consumer engagement initiatives (including engagement on its proposed changes to the pricing methodology)
