A Review of Victoria's Electricity and Gas Network Safety Framework

The AER welcomes the opportunity to make this submission in response to the further issues paper on the Victorian gas network safety framework. We have already provided a response on 28 April 2017 to your initial issues paper on the electricity safety framework.

We recognise the importance of safe and resilient distribution and transmission gas networks in Victoria. We are also cognisant that a well-functioning regulatory regime should work to support and align with desired safety outcomes. Our earlier remarks on the electricity safety framework are also relevant to the operation of the gas framework.

In this regard, it is worth also noting the proposal by two Victorian gas distribution businesses, Australian Gas Networks (AGN) and AusNet Services, to include a Capital Efficiency Sharing Scheme (CESS) in the forthcoming access arrangement (2018-22 period). The CESS is intended to provide businesses with incentives to make efficient investment decisions. The CESS provides a financial reward (penalty) for achieving efficiency gains (losses) compared to capital expenditure benchmarks (ex-ante approved levels) set by the AER. As you have noted in your issues paper, the AER has only approved an Efficiency Benefit Sharing Scheme (EBSS) for gas networks, which provides incentives for efficient operating expenditure.

At this stage, we are still reviewing the businesses' proposal of a CESS, and are due

to publish the draft decisions for each of the gas distribution and transmission businesses' access arrangements on 29 June 2017.
