Ausgrid is pleased to provide this submission to the Australian Energy Regulator's (**AER**) consultation paper on Standardised Models for Regulated Metering Services.

Ausgrid owns and operates an electricity distribution grid that is shared by approximately 4 million Australians living and working across southern Sydney to the Upper Hunter Valley. We provide metering services to more than a million customers throughout our network.

We support the introduction of standardised models that provide greater transparency in the development of metering revenues and prices. While supportive of a standardised approach, the model functionality could be amended as follows to improve transparency and functionality:

- Clarifying the purpose of the 'Output | RFM' worksheet in the model, noting that this
 worksheet draws in the same forecast capex data populated into 'Output | PTRM';
- Clarifying how diseconomies of scale factors will be applied, noting that the AER
 applied this factor by reference to changes in meter volume in Ausgrid's 2019-24
 decision,¹ while the standardised model applies diseconomies at the total opex level.
- Revising the Standardised Metering Capex and Opex Model to provide an input tab that allows networks to enter capex classifications that reflect Post Tax Revenue Model (PTRM) asset classes;
- Allowing networks to define asset classes in the 'General | Inputs' tab, in order to provide clarity concerning the scope and substance of capex;
- Checking the model for circular references;2
- Editing or removing dropdown input boxes where these are ostensibly formula-driven and should be outputs.³
