## Victorian Electricity Distribution Network Service Providers' Regulatory Proposals

Darebin City Council would like to register our serious concern regarding the magnitude of proposed increases in Operations and Maintenance charges for street lights proposed by Distribution Businesses. Darebin has street light services delivered by SP AusNet, Jemena and Citipower.

We note that the AER ruling on energy efficient lighting which set an Operations and Maintenance charge for T5 lighting was released in early 2009 and significant increases (in some cases in the order of 85%) are now proposed by Distribution Businesses prior to any large scale installations of the technology. We believe this is inappropriate and unjustified.

We also note that a significant lack of clarity remains around the monopoly or contestability status of various aspects of the street lighting service including bulk roll-outs and maintenance. Further, prices we have been quoted by Distribution Businesses to install T5 lighting for small scale installations has been more than double the amount quoted for bulk roll-out. This is a serious impediment to our intention to install T5 lighting in all new installations. We believe that these matters will require investigation and ruling via the AER as a matter of priority.

Darebin continues to work with the Northern Alliance for Greenhouse Action and the Municipal Association of Victoria to progress the installation of energy efficient street lighting

and to secure fair and reasonable costs and adequate service levels for street lighting. We plan to participate in a detailed submission to the review when the draft AER ruling is released later this year.
