Evoenergy 2023/24 electricity network pricing proposal

Evoenergy is pleased to submit its 2023/24 electricity network pricing proposal in accordance with the requirements of the National Electricity Rules and the Australian Energy Regulator's (AER's) Final Decision for Evoenergy's 2019–24 electricity network distribution determination.

Please find attached to this letter the following documents:

- electricity network pricing proposal (confidential word version; and public and confidential PDF versions);
- signed statement of compliance;
- source documents for the large-scale feed-in tariff scheme, utilities network facilities tax, and transmission pricing; and
- a confidentiality claim.

Evoenergy submitted its final standardised pricing models for standard control service and alternative control services on 31 March 2023, and we confirm there are no further changes to these models.

Evoenergy's proposed network use of system (NUOS) charges for 2023/24 are, on average, 34.9 per cent lower in nominal terms than charges in 2022/23. The main drivers of this change are a significant reduction in revenue amounts for the ACT Government's Large-scale Feed-in Tariff (LFiT) scheme and a reduction in transmission prices compared to 2022/23.

In February 2023, the ACT Government approved a negative reasonable costs determination for the LFiT for 2023/24 (i.e. a payment to customers). As agreed with the AER, Evoenergy has not included the negative costs as a jurisdictional scheme amount in its 2023/24 pricing proposal. Instead, to fulfil its obligations under ACT legislation, Evoenergy will reflect this amount as a negative adjustment to the AER's final approved network charges for 2023/24. This is described in in Evoenergy's pricing proposal. We would be pleased to provide the AER a copy of the adjusted prices once they have been finalised.

Confidential Information

Evoenergy has highlighted confidential information in the pricing proposal. The confidentiality claim provides details of the relevant sections in the proposal and relevant attachments that Evoenergy considers to be commercial-in-confidence, and the basis of these claims. The claims are made and justified in accordance with the AER's confidentiality guideline.
